

Privacy Policy

- All information regarding our clients is treated confidentially. Such information may only be disclosed when the disclosure is consistent with the client's direction and the policies of Gosselin Consulting Group LLC.
- Gosselin Consulting Group LLC does not sell any non-public, personal information to any outside individual, company, or group.
- Gosselin Consulting Group LLC does not share confidential client information with third parties, unless directed by the client or with the client's consent, or in the following circumstances:
 - As necessary to provide the services that the client has requested or authorized
 - As required by regulatory authorities or law enforcement officials, or as otherwise required by any applicable law
- Access to our clients' personal & financial data is restricted to only those partners and employees of Gosselin Consulting Group LLC who require knowledge of that information to provide service to our clients. Employees with access to confidential client information may not use or disclose the information outside of Gosselin Consulting Group LLC.
- All employees of Gosselin Consulting Group LLC are required to safeguard such information as outlined in the Code of Ethics signed by each employee and partner in the presence of the firm's Chief Compliance Officer.
